Filing a police report with your local law enforcement agency is a critical step when reporting a missing Indigenous person. This action not only initiates an official investigation within your community but also ensures that the case information is entered into national databases. These databases are essential for the broader search efforts, enabling law enforcement agencies across the country to access and share vital information about missing persons cases.

By providing this data, you are significantly enhancing the visibility of the case and the chances of finding the missing person. It creates a crucial link between local incidents and national resources, fostering a unified response to address and combat the crisis of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Peoples.
